We know this is a volunteer position for you. Our goal is to make this "job" as easy as possible, so that you can focus on the most important goal - advocating visual art education!

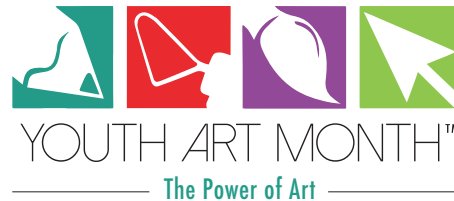
